The most imminent is the public Open House celebration at the all new station for the Lathrop-Manteca Fire District, to be held on March 31. River Islands and the Fire District have worked closely together to design, build and equip one of the finest fire stations in Northern California. Along those lines, plans for the design of the Police Administration Office are well underway, for a construction schedule starting later this year.

Please mark your calendars for April 6, when representatives of the Valley Link Train Project will be making a presentation about their plans to create an all-new transportation network that would connect River Islands to BART's Dublin/Pleasanton station.

In April, the entire Welcome Center—porch and all—will take to the road and move to the corner of Somerston Drive and River Islands Parkway. This move reflects our commitment to creating new neighborhoods and community facilities in and around our future Town Center. And the space that it leaves behind will be turned into a Community gathering area!

By May, you will be seeing some big changes along River Islands Parkway, with the opening of Islanders Field, the beginning of league play at the soccer academy and the return of our seasonal farmers market.

FIRE STATION #35 WELCOMES THE COMMUNITY TO AN OPEN HOUSE

On Sunday, March 31, the Lathrop-Manteca Fire District's state-of-the-art fire station will open with a traditional Open House for the public. From noon until 4, residents of River Islands and all of Lathrop are invited to tour the station and meet Smokey the Bear, who will be visiting for the afternoon. The fire district staff will be on hand to offer tours and answer questions. Refreshments will be served. For the first time, the community will get to see a meeting room designed and built just for them—a place for clubs,



civic organizations and groups like Neighborhood Watch to meet.

Susan Dell'Osso, President of River Islands Development, expressed her excitement about creating "this amazing asset for the entire community". The developer funded the project upfront, to allow for the highest quality of service to be provided to the residents of River Islands, delivered in the appropriate response times required by the Lathrop-Manteca Fire District's master plan.

Fire Chief Gene Neely has been closely involved with each step of the process of designing and building the station. His staff, among the best trained in the region, will continue to provide the best possible service from their new home.

Chief Neely was adamant in the move to create a true community meeting room within the new station, "to create a strong relationship between our residents and the staff of professionals which serves them."

VALLEY LINK PRESENTS ITS VISION FOR NEW TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM FOR BAY AREA COMMUTERS



An information session and Open House hosted by the Valley Link Train Project, a game-changing transportation network envisioned by the Tri-Valley and San Joaquin Valley Regional Rail Authority, is coming to the new Fire Station 35 on Saturday, April 6.

Representatives of the proposed transit authority will be making a presentation from 10:30 AM until noon, with time included for questions from the audience. All River Islands residents are invited to this informative session. Materials about the direct route to the Dublin/Pleasanton BART station and maps for the proposed system will be available as hand-outs during the day for those who cannot attend the live presentation.

River Islands has been selected as a Valley Link station. With the approval and building of this project, residents will be able to connect to BART during commute hours and on weekends.

Representatives of the Valley Link Train Project will be able to meet with people on an individual basis before and after the presentation.

REGISTER NOW FOR 9th ANNUAL "HIT THE STREETS FOR HUNGER" RUN ON APRIL 14

Principal Brenda Scholl and the entire staff of the River Islands Technology Academy are preparing for two related events to be held on the same day: the annual fun run in support of Second Harvest Food Bank and the 8th Grade Pancake Breakfast.

Both events are scheduled for April 14, and both start at 8:00 AM. There are now two different starting times to better suit the different types of runners. A one-mile run starts at 8:00 AM, and a later start time, at 8:30 gives those who want to do a 5K run their own start time.

Everyone who participates receives a Finisher Medal, and the first place winners in the Men's and Women's categories based on eight different age groups will receive special medals for their achievements.

PLANNED SHORT-TERM POWER OUTAGE ANNOUNCED FOR APRIL 7

As River Islands grows, Lathrop Irrigation District (LID) continuously looks ahead to anticipate the power needs of the community's households, schools and businesses. Part of its plan, now months in the works, is to transfer the power source from the existing line to a much larger line for greater reliability. This larger line is part of the PG&E transmission grid and it took considerable time for LID to finalize the transaction with PG&E.

To be able to make that switch over, LID is announcing a planned power outage for the entire River Islands community on the evening of Sunday April 7, when the community's power will be temporarily switched over to generator power.

During the week of April 8 - 15 all businesses and residences will be running on power provided by a generator. LID is anticipating the use of a generator to have no negative impact on the reliability of power during this time.

This switch to a generator is required to provide full backup as the River Islands power source is transferred from a 60 KB line to a 115 KB line. After the transfer is complete, the power will again be switched off to move it from the generator to its new line. At this time, that date is anticipated to be no later than April 15th.

NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR: REMINDERS FOR SPRINGTIME LIVING

As the weather becomes warmer and the days longer, it seems like everyone is outdoors. Please remember that the streets and parks at River islands are shared amenities, especially when you are walking your dog. Concerns fall into two categories: dogs off leash and dogs using the neighborhood parks, landscaping and neighborhood lawns as their pooping grounds.

The leash law is absolute, and is City law: all dogs outside of their own fenced yards must be on a leash at all times. Period. Dogs off-leash create a host of dangers to other dogs, pedestrians and small children. There is no looking the other way on this—if you have your dog off leash and you are seen, you will be ticketed.

The problem with dog poop is that, left unchecked, it creates a smelly mess for everyone to encounter. Please do your part and bring along a pickup bag when you are walking or jogging with your dog.

After so many months or rain, we can assume that even the newest landscaping installed before year's end is well-established by now. Before you turn on your automatic irrigation systems, take a minute to check it. You may not be aware, but most homebuilders turn up the landscaping water when they first install the yards to guarantee that the plants take root and establish themselves. Now, after a solid winter of rain, you can ease up on the amount of water you give your landscaping this spring and summer, since your plants are now rooted.
