RIVER ISLANDS ACCLAIMED TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY CELEBRATES ITS MOVE TO A NEW CAMPUS!

When the parents of our 570 students arrived at the River Islands Technology Academy campus for Meet the Teachers Night on August 6, they were amazed to find an even larger, more technologically-advanced campus than the one they left behind in June. Principal Brenda Scholl and her amazing teachers and staff were on hand to talk about the curriculum, the clubs and teams, and parent participation programs. "Everyone is upbeat and interested in our plans for our K-8 students this

year," said Principal Scholl. "With our new campus, we have a lot of ability to expand our facilities as we need them. And with a lake adjacent to our classrooms, one of our teachers is even talking about giving sailing lessons!"

River Islands wants to thank the City of Lathrop for its belief in the importance of the school to the community. The City of Lathrop's staff and council exemplified a "let's make it happen" spirit which allowed our new school to arise from vacant land in approximately four months.

We would also like to recognize the engineering and planning staff at River Islands, its consulting engineers and contractors, and the dedicated construction crew who worked seven days a week to create a campus at a cost of approximately six million dollars.

All of the residents at River Islands have priority seating at the new school, whose motto is "We Are College Bound". When you walk through the campus, and see the pennants representing colleges from all over the United States, it is thrilling to imagine what schools our students will attend in the years to come.

NEW PARKING LOT OPENS AT THE RIVER ISLANDS TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY

We came, we listened, and we made a big change: with approximately 570 students in our K-8 classrooms at River Islands Technology Academy, our parents were frustrated with the traffic backup in the



morning and afternoon pickup times. Principal Brenda Scholl met with the engineering and construction crews at the Project Director's office, and within a week, plans were drawn and approved for a second parking lot. Two weeks later, the parking lot was open and in use, helping parents get their kids to school on time and in safety.

RIVER ISLANDS TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY BY-THE-NUMBERS

- When you walk through the campus of the River Islands Technology Academy, here are some statistics to keep in mind:
- The school has 27 MILES of data wire, to deliver the latest technology to every classroom and office on campus
- ◆ Approximately 3,000 PLANTS AND SHRUBS have been planted, along with approximately 220 TREES
- ◆ A drip irrigation system that is FOUR MILES LONG will help the new plantings establish themselves while saving water
- ◆ THREE ACRES of ball fields have been planted in Bermuda grass, a hearty specimen that requires 20% LESS WATER
- ♦ ALL BALL FIELDS are irrigated with 100% non-potable water
- ◆ LED lighting has been installed throughout the school, for more efficient energy use

Tim Lewis Communities Prepares for Grand Opening of Shoreline!

Tim Lewis Communities is bringing a new approach to home design and two new models to River Islands! Slated for a September 19 Grand Opening date, the 3, 4 and 5 bedroom homes at Shoreline are priced from the mid-\$400,000's.

If you have been watching the models being constructed, you will have noticed a distinct difference in the streetscape: none of the homes has a garage visible from the street. Michael Woodley, project architect and recent inductee into the building industry's Hall of Fame, has designed the homes to face out to the street. Their garages are accessed from a second street behind the homes, called an alley. The result is a streetscape that focuses on the character of the front living areas of the homes.

Inside the homes, the amenities are outstanding, with such features as separate soaking tubs and showers, kitchens with breakfast nook islands,



substantial baseboards and the option of 2 car tandem, 3 and even 4 car garages.

One and two story plans are being built, although only the two story homes have furnished models to walk through. Excitement about these homes has been so great that 10 of the homes have already been sold, in advance of the neighborhood opening.

Shoreline's sales staff is happy to have you walk through the models in advance of the Grand Opening. The newly-completed sales office is open daily from 10 - 6.

Before You Start Making Changes to Your Homes: Consult the CC&Rs!

At River Islands our CC&R's (Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions) allow all of the residents to live together by adhering to certain rules. Among them are rules that prohibit making changes to the exterior design of the homes without prior approval. Changes include color changes, the addition of decorative fencing and alterations to the home itself. That approval comes from the architectural review board of the master developer.

When you are contemplating changes to the exterior of your home, re-read the CC&R's. They explain what you can and cannot do within the constraints of the community. They are considered a public document, and are available from each of the builders, at the Welcome Center and on the River Islands website, <u>www.riverislands.com</u>. Now Available: Resident Stickers - Free at the Welcome Center!

Last month, we announced the availability of "Resident" identification stickers for your cars. Their purpose is simple: with your car sticker in place, the security staff can more easily identify you as a part of the River Islands community.

Just come out to the Welcome Center and show your driver's license or a bill with your name and address on it, and the Welcome Center staff will provide you with stickers for your vehicles. If you are willing to share your email at that time, we will keep it on file to alert you in advance about changes in the community, street closures, landscaping maintenance and heavy construction that might change the routes you drive.

We have enjoyed seeing familiar faces as many of our residents have already come in; we look forward to providing you with your stickers at the Welcome Center, which is open daily from 10 - 6.
