HUGE BREAKTHROUGH FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS AS RIVER ISLANDS ANNOUNCES SCHOOL OPENINGS IN AUGUST 2022

Given an ever-growing student population, River Islands moved up its development plans and started construction of its third school last fall. The new K-8, called the EPIC Academy, will be open for instruction for next fall's term, beginning in August, 2022. EPIC Academy will serve grades kindergarten through eighth (and a 9th grade academy for one year as noted below).

The new campus is located off River Islands Parkway, between the newly-opened Cardiff and Sunset neighborhoods. As a part of the River Islands Academies, this new campus will share the curriculum, teaching style and culture of the two existing schools (River Islands Technology Academy and Next Generation STEAM Academy). River Islands residents, residents of the Banta Unified School District, and families with students already enrolled in the River Islands Academies have top priority in attending the charter schools at River Islands.

A separate part of the EPIC Academy campus has been set aside for the students of the River Islands High School Ninth Grade Academy. Opening the Ninth Grade Academy in August, 2022, allows the students graduating from River Islands Technology Academy and the Next Generation STEAM Academy an uninterrupted academic and social experience, all consistent with the vision of the River Islands Academies.

For safety, as heavy construction goes on at the permanent high school site, the Ninth Grade Academy students will go to classes and participate in student activities geared for the high schooler at the EPIC Academy campus for the 2022-2023 academic year. A complete list of classes, sports activities and electives will be posted at the River Islands Academies website in March.

In August 2023, the 9th and 10th grade classes will move over to the new high school campus. In August, 2024, the eleventh grade classrooms will open.

In August, 2025 River Islands High School will house 9th-12th grades and all of its academic, sports, arts, and social activities will be available to all of its students.






AVALON BY TRUMARK HOMES COMING IN JANUARY

Trumark Homes has acquired the largest lots available to date at River Islands for some of the largest and most luxurious homes in the master plan. Two neighborhoods, one built on a park and another on a lake, will be offered in 2022. The first, called Avalon, is opening in January for previews of its three plans—one single story and two two-story plans, with three to five bedrooms. Home sizes range from 2827 square feet for the single story home to 4,191 square feet for a 5-bedroom, two story residence. Avalon will have a neighborhood park and access to the 18-mile trail system that will ultimately encircle all of River Islands. Avalon's sales trailer (the aquarium inside is a must-see) is located along River Islands Parkway, just past the Breakwater neighborhood.
