Here we are, well into the first month of a new year, and so much is already happening! Our students are back in school, our home builders are making good progress on delivering new neighborhoods and our construction crews are working on some major community improvements.

The recent weather system has been Topic One with visitors to the Welcome Center and on social media. Since so many of our neighborhoods are being built around man-made lakes, residents ask about the possibility of the lakes rising up over their banks. While we cannot guarantee that the lakes will never overflow, we do take every precaution to monitor storm events and prepare for their effects. We actually lower lake levels prior to major storms so that the lakes can accommodate the rainwater.

In spite of the weather, roadwork has been moving ahead on the Bradshaw's Crossing Bridge, which will provide resident commuters quick access to I-5 and more importantly, take the traffic burden off of our Stewart Road entrance. When Bradshaw's Crossing Bridge opens, we expect all construction traffic to move to River Islands Parkway for access to new development areas. We also expect to see the parents of students who live outside of the community to use River Islands Parkway as their main road for drop off and pick up. At this time, we anticipate the opening of Bradshaw's Crossing Bridge to take place in the Spring.

I would like to take a moment to recognize the generosity of our residents, who made our annual Giving Tree program an over-the-top success. In response to a wave of early contributions to the program, we were able to expand our program to include double the number of families to receive our bounty, provide for a dozen veterans and add to the number of animal shelters being gifted as well. Second Harvest Food Bank was the recipient of the canned goods that were collected at the Welcome Center. A heartfelt thank you to everyone in the River Islands community for remembering that the holidays are all about GIVING.

GROUND BREAKING HELD FOR NEW FIRE STATION

River Islands hosted a group of about seventy five people in mid-December for the ground breaking of a new fire station for the Lathrop Manteca Fire Department.

The new fire department building will be constructed on approximately two acres of land within the River Islands Business Campus, at the intersection of Somerston Parkway and Golden Valley Parkway. It will also serve as the site for the department's administration office. It will provide services to all aspects of the River Islands community, as well as the homes and businesses in the Lathrop-Manteca area.

Ultimately, Fire Station 35 will house eight on-duty crew members in its approximately 12,300 square foot building. In addition to providing a home base for crew members, the station will also feature a meeting room for fire board and community meetings.

Chief Gene Neely, Fire Board President Gloryanna Rhodes and Susan Dell'Osso all spoke at the ceremony, before joining Lathrop Mayor Sonny Dhaliwal and Vice Mayor Steve Dresser, among other dignitaries, in a ground breaking ceremony.

SEVEN NEIGHBORHOODS TO BE OPEN AT RIVER ISLANDS IN 2017!


In 2017, River Islands will enjoy hosting SEVEN new home communities, each with its own character and unique architectural features. Two of the neighborhoods opened their models in November of last year— Summer House by Van Daele Communities and 360 Lakeside by Kiper Homes and have already received a tremendous response from home buyers.

Next to open will be Tim Lewis Communities' Crystal Cove neighborhood, offering two 2-story plans and two single story home designs. Prices will range from the low \$400,000s. The sales office and models are expected to be open by mid-February; until then, a sales team is working from one of the model homes at Shoreline.

In late February, The New Home Company will open its Tidewater neighborhood, where all homes are being built in the Savannah style of architecture. The neighborhood has been previewing its floorplans and elevations from a trailer onsite; the models will showcase a number of customizing options that the New Home Company has planned. Prices are expected to start in the low \$400,000s.

Richmond American Homes is putting a trailer onsite in the next few weeks to preview its plans for its Sandpointe neighborhood. Construction will be working toward a late spring opening date for the model homes, priced from the \$400,000s.
