OPEN LETTER FROM SUSAN DELL'OSSO PRESIDENT, RIVER ISLANDS DEVELOPMENT

River Islands held a Town Hall Meeting last month, with a plan of providing information and answering questions about the processes involved in upholding our community's CC&Rs. We also organized a presentation by Lathrop Irrigation District (LID) regarding electrical power issues.

More than 150 residents attended, representing a wide range of households, including some that have been a part of River Islands since its earliest move-ins and some brand-new residents looking for clarification before starting home improvement projects.

We came to talk, but we also came to listen. And as a result, we learned a lot about our community that we had not been aware of. Many speakers made helpful suggestions and alerted us to issues we did not know. We greatly appreciated the candid conversation that evening, and welcome input at any time.

The day after the meeting, in the early morning hours, I drove around the community, taking notes and making calls to those departments that are responsible for invasive weeds, public landscaping maintenance and irregularities in upkeep around our levees.

Within a week of the meeting, an executive team met to start-up an all-new service for weed abatement. Within 10 days, everyone who had left a phone number at the meeting had a phone call back from me, to get to the heart of the matter. The end result is evidenced in making a number of changes necessary to uphold the beauty and safety of River Islands.

I want to thank everyone who came out to listen, to speak or to support their neighbors in their requests. More than that, I want to commend our residents for asking good questions, bringing forward information and providing us with ideas for making things work more smoothly. I look forward to hosting another Town Hall event before the end of the year.

INSIDE OUR COMMUNITY CC&RS

Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs) are put in place to establish standards for the community. Good maintenance and abiding by the terms in the CC&R document help retain the overall beauty of River Islands and can enhance its lifestyle.

We formed the CC&R Team to identify maintenance and construction violations and to enforce the development standards. All homeowners are responsible for maintaining, if applicable, their front yards, side yards, back yards, lake slopes, parkway strips, sidewalks and street trees in the parkway strips. General maintenance includes, but is not limited to weed-pulling, adequate watering of plants, paint touch-ups and fence or dock repair.

For those interested in making alterations to the front landscaping or exterior of your home that differ from the original design, the process starts with simply filling out a CC&R application, always available on www.MyRiverIslands.com. The rule of thumb is: if your requested changes will be visible to neighbors and the rest of the community, you will need approval first. A complete Power Point, presented by Susan Dell'Osso in the last Town Hall Meeting, is available online at MyRiverIslands.com as well.

WHEN TO SEEK APPROVAL



There are certain changes that do not need approval from River Islands or the CC&R team, such as replacing dead plants or mulch with the same kind and color, touching up exterior paint, "hardscape" in the back yard and seat walls less than 48" tall with some exceptions.


Any alterations to the original design of the home and landscaping DO need approval from River Islands and the CC&R team ahead of time. This includes new structures in the front or back yard, swimming pools, paint changes, driveway extensions and any changes on a lake slope.

If your improvement is significant and requires approval from another agency, the CC&R team will indicate what else is required and will help with the process. This includes the parkway strips owned by the City of Lathrop but designated to be maintained by the homeowner. We have a phone line specifically set up to receive calls for nonemergency community-related issues such as: reporting graffiti, broken park structures or streetlights, irrigation leakage, trash dumping and more. Please report these concerns by calling (209) 888-4586. Also, the City of Lathrop recently launched a new phone app called "Lathrop Cares". We encourage all of you to download the app. It allows you to alert the City about all types of issues, with varying levels of concerns. The City monitors this app daily and appreciates the way it helps to streamline maintenance, or non-emergency items.
